You can now Publish with PeerJ for Life, for Free

When a paper is accepted for publication in PeerJ, the University of Kansas Libraries will automatically pay the cost of a life-time basic publishing plan for the first 38 KU faculty or graduate students (on the KU-Lawrence or KUMC campuses). Once a paper is accepted, that plan will allow you to publish one PeerJ article every year, for life, for free. Your life-time basic publishing plan remains yours, even if you leave the University of Kansas!

The Libraries are pleased to provide this benefit to support our faculty in their desire to publish their work as Open Access.

About PeerJ

PeerJ is an Open Access, peer-reviewed, scholarly journal.

It considers and publishes Research Articles in the Biological Sciences, Medical Sciences, and Health Sciences.

PeerJ judges the soundness of the science, not its importance.
